





Financial Support

What to Know about Health Insurance

Maximize Your Benefits

Most transplant centers have a financial coordinator who will work with you and your insurance company.

It is important to tell your financial coordinator upfront about all of your insurance policies so that he or she can maximize your benefits and minimize your out-of-pocket expenses.



Cancer Insurance Policies

Some patients have a cancer policy and expect the policy to cover the full cost of treatment. Cancer policies do not replace full insurance plans or provide sufficient benefits to cover the cost of a transplant or CAR T-cell therapy. Rather, they help cover things like deductibles and co-pays on your main health insurance policy and lost income.

Health Insurance Cost-Sharing Ministries

Some patients belong to a health insurance cost-sharing ministry. These arrangements are not considered insurance by most transplant and CAR T-cell centers because there is no guarantee that the fund will pay your medical bills.

Consequently, most centers will require a significant deposit from you up-front before beginning treatment.
